Content areas of a syllabus

- course title and description and any prerequisites or co-requisites;
- instructor name and contact info (optional: TAs)
- course structure (e.g. lecture, lab, hours per week, time, location)
- course schedule including a list of topics
- course-level learning outcomes or objectives
- description of activities to achieve outcomes (e.g. participation, essays)
- required learning materials (e.g. textbooks) with estimated costs
- methods of assessment including weights; policies on late or missed work
- resources to support student learning
- statement about UBC's values and policies (see next slide)
